### Innovative Haptic Glove for Hands-Free Sewing Machine Operation

Researchers from the Fashion Technology department at Sona College of Technology, Salem, have developed a patented haptic glove that allows individuals with limited limb movement to operate pedal-based sewing machines using hand pressure. Designed by Dr. D. Raja, Dr. Mani Krishnan, Dr. S. S. Suresh and student contributors Akalya Mani M, Girija S, Monish Bharathy H, and Rajendra Kumar S, the nylon-spandex glove replaces foot control with palm pressure through an embedded haptic sensor and wireless transmitter linked to a microcontroller. This breakthrough aims to support people with lower-limb disabilities, enhancing opportunities for employment and inclusivity in the garment industry.
