

**Punishment for candidates indulging in Malpractice**

<b>First Level Offence</b>

1.1	A candidate writing his/her register number in the answer booklet other than the space provided.	A warning will be issued to the candidate with a penalty of <b>Rs.3000/-</b> .  Such answer booklets will be evaluated after enquiry.	Invalidating that particular course of the candidate with a penalty of <b>Rs.3000/-</b> .  If this happened for the third time, such candidate will be punished under <b>Second level offence</b> category.
1.2	A candidate writing his/her name anywhere in the answer booklet.		
1.3	A candidate in a motto of distinguishing his/her by writing specific marks in the answer script.		
1.4	A candidate plead to pass him/her in the examination.		
1.5	A candidate writing his/her personal or financial conditions in the answer booklet to appeal for mercy.		
1.6	A candidate either possessing the question papers of another candidate or passing the question papers to another candidate with answers in the question paper. (both theory and practical examinations)	A severe warning will be issued to the candidate with a penalty of <b>Rs.3000/-</b>	
1.7	A candidate communicating with other candidate and getting answers in/outside examination hall/lab. (both theory and practical examinations)		
1.8	A candidate involving a vigorous argument with hall invigilator/chief superintendent or any other officials in duty regarding the enquiry of not wearing ID cards/hall ticket missing/ dress codes/ not co-operating for frisking process/not following the examination code of conduct.

2.1	A candidate doing first level offence for the third time in examination.	A severe warning will be issued to the candidate with a penalty amount of <b>Rs.5000/-</b>  Invalidating all the <b>current semester</b> course	Such candidate is liable to pay penalty amount of <b>Rs.5000/-</b> for each <b>course registered by the candidate (regular and arrear)</b> .  Invalidating all the examinations
2.2	A candidate facilitating another candidate to copy from his/her answer script, or he/she is copying from the other candidates answer scripts. <b>(Both will be booked)</b> .		
2.3	A candidate possessing any incriminating materials such as bit papers, printed materials related to that examination.		
2.4	A candidate had written in his/her Hall ticket, handkerchief, dress or anywhere in parts of the body,		

	scale, calculator or geometric materials he/she possess during examination.	registered by the candidate.	of the courses registered.
2.5	A candidate had written in data books, statistical tables, graphs or any other usable materials allowed during the examination.	If a candidate is from a passed-out batch, then all the registered courses (arrears) will be invalidated.	If this happened for the third time, such candidate will be punished under <b>Third level offence</b> category.
2.6	A candidate possessing or circulating question paper of another candidate with information related to the examination.		
2.7	A candidate requests the invigilator to give tips or answers related to the examination.		
2.8	A candidate possessing restricted electronic gadgets like programmable calculators, watches, blue tooth devices, earphones or any other smart materials capable of conveying/storing information related to that examination.		
2.9	A candidate possessing <b>mobile phone(s)</b> with him/her during the examination. (either in switched on/off condition)	Such a candidate is liable to pay a penalty of <b>Rs.4000/-</b> must be paid to <b>all the courses registered by the candidate.</b>	

### Third Level Offence

MPC No.	Nature of Malpractice	Punishment
3.1	A candidate using mobile phone and sending question papers to outsiders/ receiving answers from outsiders through his/her mobile phone and writing in the examination.	A penalty of <b>Rs.10,000/-</b> to <b>all the courses registered by the candidate.</b>  Such candidate will be forfeit for the award of pursuing degree.  Malpractice committee recommends to the management to debar the candidate permanently.
3.2	A candidate involving in misbehaving activities by writing offensive words/ writing examination in drunken condition/causing disturbance to other candidates /spoiling examination environment/destroying any college property causing threat to other candidate/trying to attack the invigilator/chief superintendent or any other officials involved in examination duty.	
3.3	A candidate involved in impersonation.	

- If a candidate is booked under malpractice, he/she is **not eligible to apply for revaluation of any courses registered. Further their placement opportunities may get affected.**
- If a candidate is in final year or from passed out batches requesting in the answer booklet to pass the examination, then all the courses he/she had taken up will be scrutinized. If it is repeated, then the courses registered are all invalidated.
- If a candidate had only arrear examinations and indulged in malpractice, then all the courses registered are invalidated.
