TIME TRAVEL

How would it be if you can go back to your past and change your moments of embarrassment, grief etc., or how would it be if you were able to go to your future to see if you have reached your goal in life.

This sounds great as well as mind boggling too. A question might have arisen in everyone's mind, "How is time travel possible?"

And the answer to your question is here. We all know that light travels at a speed of 300000 kilometers per second. Travelling at the speed of light can take you to your future and travelling beyond the speed of light would take you to your past. But the exception is that nothing except the photons (light particles) can travel at the speed of light.

Only massless particles can reach the speed of light which implies that your mass should be zero if you want to reach the speed of light.

But astronomers are time travellers too, even though they don't reach the speed of light they travel at a very high orbital speed which makes them travel to their future.

In this case the time difference between the actual and the travelled time with respect to earth is negligible.

There are many hypothetical ways which allows time travel to be possible, for example travelling at the edge of a black hole or through a wormhole or travelling on a tipler cylinder (infinite cylinder) might allow you time travel.

1. BLACK HOLES

Black hole are holes found in the space time. These are formed when huge stars collapse in the space. The stars collapse due to their own gravity as they run out of fuel after many years of their formation.

The black hole has immense gravity that nothing can escape through it. Even light can't escape through a black hole. Due to it's immense gravity it pulls all the other heavenly bodies towards it at a very high speed. So travelling at the edge of the black hole can make time travel possible.

2. WORM HOLES

Worm holes are short cuts in space time. It can connect one point of the space to a totally different point which might be several astronomical units apart. Placing a black hole and acceleration one of the mouth of the wormhole and travelling through it can make us travel in time.

3. TIPLER CYLINDER (or) INFINITE CYLINDER

Tipler cylinder is a massive and long cylinder which spins around it's longitudinal axis at a very high speed. The length of the tipler cylinder or infinite cylinder should be infinite as the name suggests. So, travelling around the tipler cylinder in spiral paths would allow time travel. But we should also remember that all these are hypothetical means of time travel which were solutions to the equations of general relativity.

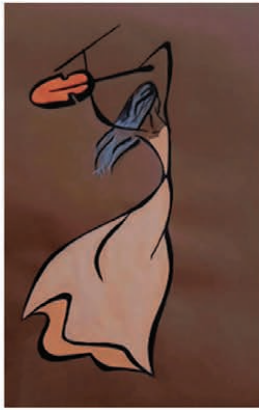

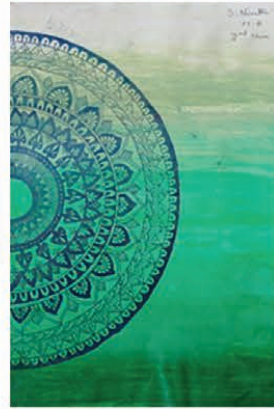

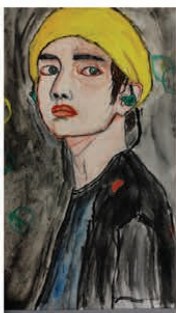
